Wellies, Father Ted, and Goats – Festivals in Ireland

Are you planning a trip to Ireland, and want to see the different, the unusual, perhaps journey off the beaten track? Are the castle tours getting too passé for your taste? The Emerald Isle offers a wide variety of festivals throughout the year that may appeal to your sense of adventure. Here is a list of just a few of the annual celebrations offered during the course of the year.

Castlecomer Wellie Festival – Co. Kilkenny – January 1

This annual event is a long standing fixture on the New Year calendar and must rank as one of the most unusual events in Ireland. At the heart of the festivities is the Wellie race, in which competitors' race over a 5km circuit of roads wearing Wellington rubber boots, aka Wellies.

The wellies must be standard unaltered issue – not the best footwear for running, but it is quite a sight to see hundreds of runners lined up suitably shod at the start of the race.

Many of those taking part wear costumes also, but there are also those who take the race very seriously, in spite of the nonchalant demeanor, and it is hotly contested.

The race is preceded by a parade through the streets of Castlecomer with floats created by local businesses and community groups. The race has been taking place annually since 1981.

TedFest 5 – February 24-27 – Inishmore, Aran Islands, Co. Galway

The festival celebrates the cult TV series Father Ted, and as anyone familiar with it will know that means madness, mayhem and

Planned events include Buckaroo and Movie Charades, a Jesuit Country & Western Hour, Priests v Nuns Beach Volleyball, and the annual Lovely Girls Competition!

The event is limited to just over 100 people. Knowing the words of the famous and much loved Father Ted composition, "My Lovely Horse," and an undying love of tea and sandwiches are required attributes for those attending, although there is a beer garden for those who tire of tea!

Lisdoonvarna Matchmaking Festival – Co. Clare – October 1-31

Europe's largest Matchmaking Festival draws throngs of people to Lisdoonvarna each year, and if you cannot find that special person at one of the many events, there are matchmakers on hand to assist.

It's an extraordinary event, with dancing and music beginning most days at noon and continuing non-stop into the small hours of the morning.

The best known of the matchmakers is Willie Daly, who deals in horses when not dealing in love and who claims to have been instrumental in getting hundreds, if not thousands, of couples to the altar.

Some nods to change are incorporated – there are speed-dating events these days – but mostly the modus operandi is to provide lots of opportunities for people to get together at dances, sessions and in the pubs.

Each weekend the events are focused on some activity, from horse racing on the opening weekend, country music the following one, three weekends devoted to dancing, then the final fling, where the Queen of the Burren and Mr. Lisdoonvarna are crowned.

The Dunmore-East-Bluegrass Festival, Dunmore-East, Co. Waterford - August

This Bluegrass Festival usually takes place on the last Thursday through Monday in August in the town of Dunmore East. The festival has been organized since 1995 by Mick Daly, who mixes old-time country, bluegrass and futuristic newgrass acts.

Castle Palooza Festival – Charleville Castle, Co. Offaly – July

The Castle Palooza Festival is a boutique Irish music festival usually occurs on the August Bank Holiday weekend i.e., the first weekend in August. There are massages, dance classes, art exhibitions and full beauticians available. Hot showers are promised by the organizers.

Puck Fair – Kilorglin, Co. Kerry – August

The Puck Fair occurs the second Thursday until the following

The Puck Fair occurs the second Thursday until the following Sunday in August, in Kilorglin.

Festival history has it that Oliver Cromwell's army invaded the area of Kerry at the foot of the McGillicuddy Reeks mountain range. They pushed a grazing herd of goats aside, but a male goat (or puck) charged past the army, and into the village of Kilorglin, where he arrived exhausted and panting. This goat gave the village of Kilorglin enough notice to hide their livestock.

Every year a group of people go up the mountains near Kilorglin and catch a wild goat, which is then put into a small cage on a tall stand. He will then be crowned the King of the Puck Fair. The goat's silence will serve as an acceptance of the title.

Get your passports ready. Excitement awaits the traveler.

"Comas" Makes North American Debut at ICHC Jan. 15

Firmly rooted in Irish music and keeping a respectful eye on the past, *Comas* (Irish Gaelic for power,) makes room for original compositions and influences. The band, which has performed exclusively in Europe since 2003, will make their North American debut at the Irish Cultural and Heritage Center, 2133 W. Wisconsin Ave., on Saturday, Jan. 15 at 7:30 p.m.

Individually based in Brittany, Ireland, Belgium and the United States, the band members forged their varied cultural influences into a unique blend of traditional Irish music that has made them enormously popular at major European music festivals. London's *Irish Post* called them "one of Europe's most sensational Celtic bands" and "four of the most exciting musicians of their generation."

Comas fiddle player Aidan Burke, cousin of well-known fiddler Kevin Burke, was the unintentional catalyst for *Comas*. He invited Irish-American percussionist Jackie Moran and Breton flute/uilleann pipes player Sylvain Barou to add tracks on a solo album he was working on at the recording studio of guitarist/bouzouki player Philip Masure in Belgium. They organized a few gigs to help pay travel expenses and enjoyed the experience so much that they formed a band.

Moran who was born in Co. Tipperary and emigrated to Chicago when he was 10, is familiar to Milwaukee area audiences as a founding member of bands including *Bua*, *The Drovers* and *Wilding* as well as performances with Liz Carroll, John Williams, and John Doyle, among others.

Tickets for the show are \$19 in advance and \$23 the day of concert with discounts for students and groups. The subscription price for three of the Hallamor concerts is \$51.30. The Classic Celtic concert on March 20 is \$10 or \$61.30 for all four concerts. To order online, visit [www.ichc.net]. Tickets may also be ordered by calling (414) 345-8800.

Canadian singer-songwriter David Francey will be presenting his beautifully crafted songs, colorful stories, and wry sense of humor back for a third concert at the Irish Fest Center, 1532 Wauwatosa Ave., Milwaukee, on Sunday, Jan. 16. Tickets for the 3 p.m. show are \$15.

New Hampshire based guitarist/bouzouki player Craig Werth will accompany Francey as well as add harmonies and some of his own original songs.

The Scottish-born Francey was working as a construction site carpenter when he won the first of three JUNO Awards (the Canadian equivalent of the Grammy) in 2002 for his second album, *Far End of Summer*. He left carpentry shortly thereafter to pursue a full time career as a performing artist.

Francey is recognized internationally as one of today's finest singer-songwriters and performs at festivals and concert stages across North America, Europe and Australia. He has been honored with multiple awards and nominations, most recently the 2010 John Lennon Songwriting Award Grand Prize in the folk category for *The Waking Hour* from the album of the same name.
